THE LORD BE WITH ALL OF YOU by Pastor Jim Watson

This month, I chose a Prayer 3:16 verse that's simple, yet powerful. From Paul's second letter to the Christians in the town of Thessalonica:

The Lord be with all of you 2 Thess. 3:16b

This is one of many New Testament letters that deals with controversies, factions, and the need to be discerning about what is true. Several passages in the letter could be used to divide people. Yet here, at the end of the letter, Paul is expressing blessing, that God be with all of the people. As someone who grew up feeling like an outsider to the church, this kind of blessing catches my attention! We've just celebrated the birth of Jesus, who is also given the name Emmanuel, meaning God-with-us, and who is clearly worshipped as God-made-flesh, the One who brings God's full divinity into our full humanity. In Christ, we are called to say with Paul: "The Lord be with all of you."

For us at Zion, the end of the year 2019 marks a time when we reached out with this blessing. At Purpose Palooza, we invited everybody, encouraging each person to ask "What is God doing through me?" We opened our doors and our hearts to Operation Homes, as a full partner and host congregation, and found ourselves blessed in return. We dedicated new hymnals which were designed to help us be open to more people. We connected in new ways with students in the Buckeye schools and others in the community. A number of our members have even begun working through personal loss and tragedy to be able to help other people who might be struggling too. God is working through all of the people, so that the world might know that God is with all people.

I pray that this kind of blessing will continue strongly in 2020! Early in the year, we'll be talking about several ways this might play out. In an "additional staff conversation," we can give thought and prayer and discernment to how God is calling all of us at Zion to be organized and equipped - are there ways in which another staff person could help us support the ministry of all? I'm also looking forward to working with families and leaders as we consider how to include kids in Holy Communion. How do we prepare them for their call to be part of God's blessing in the world, and what's the best way to include them in the holy meal that forms us as the Body of Christ? And we'll be starting the project of updating Zion's web site. How can we best tell God's story, and use the technology available to us to coordinate the work we share?

I firmly believe that the Holy Spirit is moving through all of the people at Zion, gathering, enlightening, and calling us as "the church on the hill" to keep shining God's light out to the world. Thanks for your partnership so far! And in this new year, may the Lord be with all of you in powerful new ways!


